
How to Cite an Internet Resource

- 2. Date written
- 3. Title of the article
- 4. Specific path (url)


How to Cite a Book

The information you need:

- 5. Author's name
- 6. Title of the book
- 7. Publisher
- 8. Place and year of publication
- 9. Chapter number and pages (optional)
- 10. Page numbers of the article

Use your information and follow the example.

How to Cite a Chapter or Article in a Book


Use this example when a book has a collection of articles or stories by different people.

The information you need:

- 1. Author's name
- 2. Title of the chapter or article
- 3. Page numbers of the article
- 4. Names of the editor or editors of the book
- 5. Publisher of book
- 6. Place and year of publication


How to Cite a Magazine/Journal Resource

The information you need:

- 11. Author's name
- 12. Title of the article
- 13. Name of the magazine or journal
- 14. Volume number, issue number, or month
- 15. Page numbers of the article

Use your information and follow the example.

How to Cite a Newspaper Resource

The information you need:

- 16. Author's name
- 17. Title of the article
- 18. Name of the newspaper
- 19. Date article was written
- 20. Edition (if there is one)
- 21. Section

Use your information and follow the example.
